We received a very special delivery too...our class caterpillars! This half term we are learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and reading the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.


It might have been a short week this week but it certainly was a busy one!

In Maths we have been looking at numbers beyond 10. We have looked at how teen numbers are made by splitting them into tens and ones. The children have used Numicon to support with this so they can explore what happens when two amounts go together. As always, we have loved having the Number Blocks help with this.
