

The Pupil Engagement census

Over the next two weeks, we will be asking pupils in Key Stage 2 to participate in The Pupil Engagement Census in school.

This is a national project, with up to 150000 young people taking part across England.

The questions are about pupils' relationship towards school, including their feelings about learning, themselves, their friends and adults in school. There will be 40 questions to answer and the survey should take no longer than 15 minutes to complete.
